Education Officer (VP), UCD Students' Union 2014 - 2015


- Elected by over 1,500 peers to the role after an engagement campaign focused on initiatives including Skills for Life, Peer Assisted Learning, and recognition of extra-curricular learning.
- Coached 500+ students who visited my office for confidential support, advice, and solutions to various problems. Guided students through processes such as registration, grant/funding applications, extenuating circumstances applications, appealing exam results and EDI issues.
- Developed organisational awareness, advocated for student needs and rights, and assisted in developing university policies as a member of UCD's senior decision-making bodies; Governing Authority, UCD Academic Council and University Management Team.
- Designed and executed two student skills development programmes called 'Lead UCD' and 'Skills for Life'. Across both programmes 90 students participated in 6 skills workshops and 2 company visits.
- Collaborated with AIB, EY and the US Embassy in Ireland who sponsored our skills programmes in return for increased brand visibility and access to engaged students.

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- What is a motivation question?
- Why do employers ask motivation questions?
- How can I prepare?

Employer perspective – what they want to know

Will you do the job?

- Have you done your research?
- What are your reasons for applying?
- Are you motivated by your career choice?

Give evidence that you have the **commitment, motivation and drive** for the position

Can you do the job?

- Academic performance
- Work experience, extra-curriculars, volunteering
- Proven set of skills

Give tailored examples which show you **match** the needs of the role

Will you fit in?

- Culture, values, work environment

Provide evidence that **links** you to the organisation



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Demonstrate that you thoroughly understand what the role involves

Self audit; how do you match the requirements?

Why would like to work with us?

Say why you would specifically like to work for this employer

Balance what you will learn/gain from the role vs what you will contribute to the role/work

Ingredients

- 8 ounces whole wheat pasta

- What's new: new products, impact of, any growing areas?

Where to look?

Website: Press releases, annual reports, mission statements, organisational structure

People: LinkedIn, Glassdoor, Events

External: Social Media, Publications, News, Media

Role

- What would you be doing day to day?
- What is expected of you?
- What are you particularly interested in?

Job specification & job description

Sector

- How does the sector operate?
- What current issues is the sector facing?
- Any challenges or opportunities?
