| Is this position paid? | Yes- successful candidates receive a bursary equivalent to £37.60 per week throughout term-time. |
| Time commitment | 4 hours per week during term-time (hours flexible around studies). |

What does the Mature and Part-time Students' Officer do?

The Mature and Part-time Students' Officer is the main representative of both mature and part-time students within the Students' Union and LSE as a whole, championing a group that is often under-represented in elected positions across both institutions.

You will do this through a variety of ways, such as campaigning on issues that affect your constituency and directing the Student Union's work centred around improving the student experience for mature and part-time students at LSE. You will also have the chance to put on events for your constituency throughout the year, as well as championing the views of Mature and Part-time Students as a member of the SU Executive Committee, one of the main decision-making bodies of the organisation.

You should nominate yourself if...

- You wish to champion a group of students whose voices are often not heard during their time studying at LSE.
- You want to make changes at LSE and LSESU to ensure mature and part-time students have a positive experience at both institutions.
- You want a flexible role that you can fit around your studies and other commitments.
- You want to develop your leadership skills as a member of the SU Executive Committee, and improve your CV.

How to nominate yourself

- Go to www.lsesu.com/elections and fill out a nomination form.
- Nominations open at 10am on Monday 10th October and close at 5pm Monday 17th October. Nominations submitted after this point will not be accepted.
- Students can vote online between 10am on Wednesday 26th October and 7pm on Thursday 27th October.
